Remember, read at home at least three times a week. The more you read, the better at reading you will get.

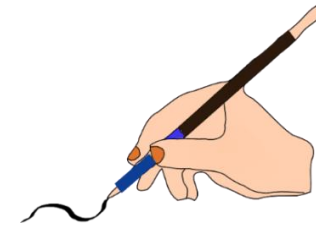
### Spellings

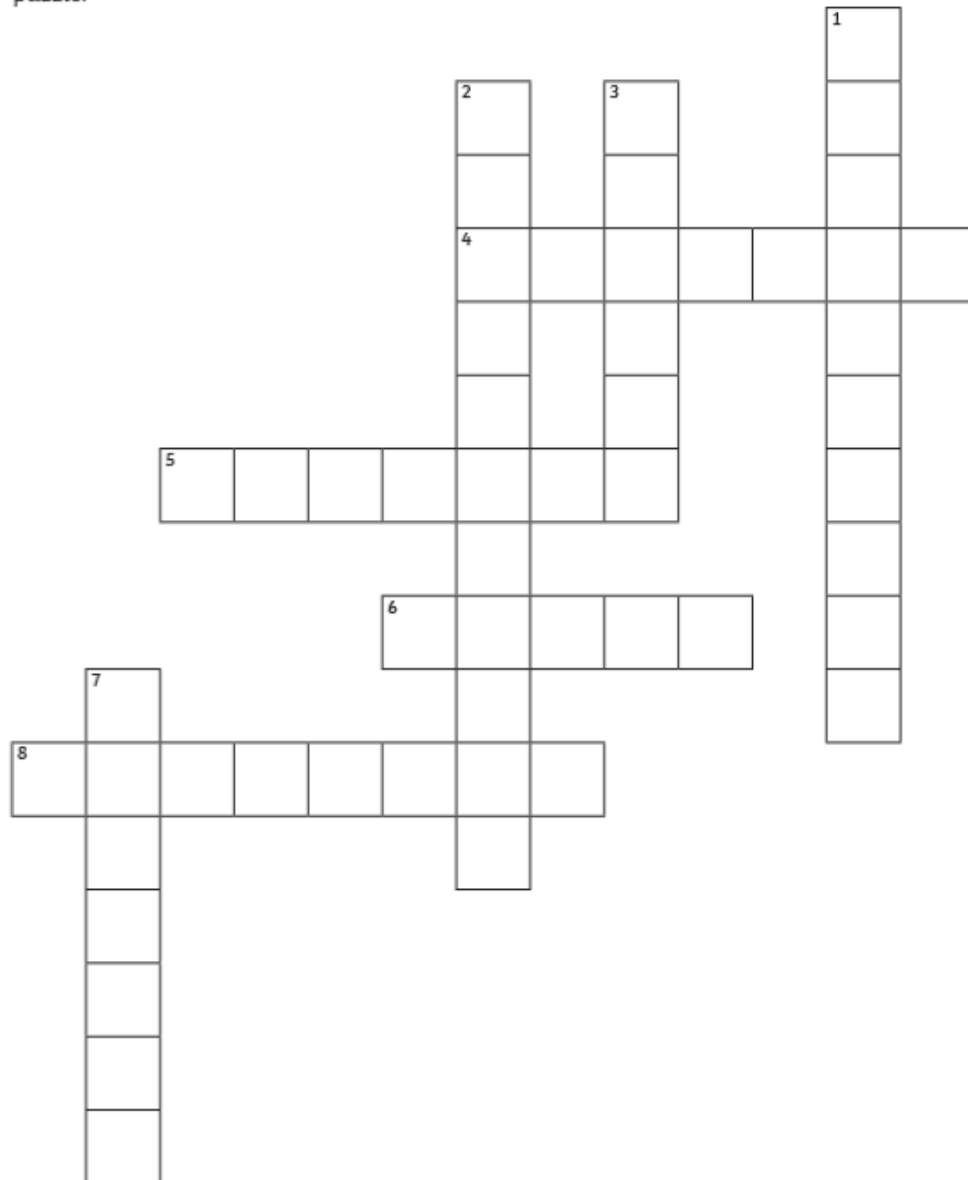
