General Tasks

Remember to keep up with reading, both silently to yourself, but also regularly out loud to someone else, in order to practise expression and flow.

Continue to practise your times tables, using a range of online games as well as getting an adult to test you orally. Remember to aim for answers within 6 seconds and without using fingers!

Science:

Last week, you looked at different habitats and animals that live there. Habitats give animals food, shelter and the right conditions to do well. When habitats change, it can be very dangerous to the plants and animals that live there. Look at the information on the 2 slides below about the effects on animals.

We would like you to design a poster to explain the importance of keeping habitats clean and litter free. Can you make your poster colourful and eye catching?



PSHE:

Habitats and Habitat Threats



Even small changes to the habitat of a living thing can be dangerous.

Habitats and Habitat Threats

- Litter can cause injury to animals. Animals can cut themselves or get tangled or trapped in rubbish.
- Animals might eat litter, this could poison or injure them.
- Fire caused by humans can kill animals and plants.
- Chemicals in or near water can kill water plants, fish and insects and pollute the water source for birds and animals who live nearby.
- Roads are dangerous for animals, who are often hit by cars.
- Cutting down trees and building new structures can destroy plants and animal homes.
- Walls and fences can get in the way of pathways used by animals to reach food and water.
- Tall grass and flowers are an important habitat. Plants and animals lose their habitat when it is cut down.
